

In CONGRESS,
NOVEMBER 1, 1777.

INASMUCH as it is the indispensable duty of all men to adore the superintending providence of Almighty God; to acknowledge with gratitude their obligations to Him for benefits received; and to implore such farther blessings as they stand in need of: And it having pleased him in his abundant mercy, not only to continue to us the innumerable bounties of his common providence; but also to bestow upon us, in the prosecution of a just and necessary war, the assistance of his special providence in the attainment of our unalienable rights and liberties: Particularly in that he hath vouchsafed to unite us in one confederacy, and to superintend the means used for the support of our troops, and to crown our arms with success: And it is therefore recommended to the legislative power of these States, to set on foot a day of public prayer, on the eighteenth day of December next, for the purpose of thanksgiving and supplication, that the good people may express their gratitude to the Divine Benefactor: and that, together with their confession of their sins, whereby they had forfeited every favor; and that they may please God through the merits of Jesus Christ, mercifully to forgive and blot them out of remembrance; and may please him graciously to afford his blessing on the Governments of these States respectively, and prosper the Councils of the whole. To inspire our commanders both by land and sea, and all under them, with that wisdom and fortitude which may render them fit instruments, under the providence of Almighty God, to secure for these United States, the greatest of all human blessings, INDEPENDENCE and PEACE. That it may please him, to prosper the trade and manufactures of the people, and the labour of the husbandman, that our land may yet yield its increase. To make schools and seminaries of education, so necessary for cultivating the principles of true liberty, virtue and piety, under his sustaining hand: and to prosper the means of religion, for the promotion and enlargement of that kingdom which consisteth "IN RIGHTEOUSNESS, PEACE AND JOY IN THE HOLY GHOST."

And it is further recommended, that fervent prayer, and such supplications, as though it were their innocent, may be offered for the purpose of this appointment, may be used on the said day.
